ALL-STAR PROGRAM (CLASS B or C) USA RULES

1. Purpose -The purpose of the All-Star Program is to provide an opportunity for the League to designate standout players to represent their league in a summer tournament program.

2. Eligibility- All-Star teams must conform to the following definitions of eligibility in order to be eligible for the All-Star Program.

a. The team must be approved by and represent an approved single Recreational League OR follow the guidelines as needed for the Interleague All-Stars (see below). b. The team must select players through an approved All-Star selection process as defined in the league's operating policies and approved by the local USA Softball Association. c. The team must represent a specific age division including 8 & Under, 10 & Under, 12 & Under, 14 & Under. 23 USA Softball – Pacific Coast Region 10 2025 JO Policies and Procedures

d. All players must have participated in 75% of their recreational league season. e. Any player that participates with any other team outside of the recreational league after March 15th forfeits their eligibility for All-Stars.

f. The All-Star team shall not try-out, select, announce, practice, meet, or play together before the last Saturday in April.

g. If the league selects a single league team, this team must meet the requirements above in which the league uses a fair distribution of talent.

h. High school players are eligible to return to the league that they participated in during the previous calendar year. Teams may not have more than five (5) high school players on their roster.

i. The team must follow all requirements outlined in the PARTICIPATION portion of this document. note: Teams that do not participate in a recreational league season are ineligible to be Class B or Class Classification

3. Classification All teams in the All-Star Program are classified as B teams. The JO Commissioner is responsible for re-classifying teams to the "C" classification who cannot compete at the B level.

4. Participation Teams must conform to the following participation requirements in order to remain eligible for the All- Star program.

a. Teams may participate in any USA Softball Sanctioned B or C Tournament. b. Teams must have the approval of the Junior Olympic Commissioner to participate in any Non USA Softball Sanctioned Events.

5. Championship Play Teams may choose to enter Championship Play to represent their League with the intent to move forward to the next level of competition if so qualified. a. Teams are eligible to participate in the C Association Championships. Teams finishing in a qualifying position will advance to the C Regional.

b. Teams attending the Class C Regional are eligible to pick-up 3 players out of the C Association Championship.

Spring Softball is a fun, instructional league designed to help players of all skill levels learn fundamentals and enjoy team play in a lightly competitive, supportive environment.

Summer All-Stars is a competitive tournament program that brings together top-performing players to represent the league in advanced summer play.

Fall Ball offers a lower level of structured play focused on skill development, game

strategy, and continued growth beyond the regular season.

- Each player **must** play 75% of spring ball with njgsl
- Birthdays must follow USA softball guidelines (4 girls total in our 13U league who do not fall in 12U range-Holley Gelardi, Olive Tevere, Julia Claustro, Sophia Rossmiller-kiwanis) 14 girls registration \$2450 per team- (roughly \$450 jerseys + \$150 socks + \$100 visors
